## THE FORUM

We have two responses to the last Forum question; I really pleased by the continuing response!!

". . .in response to Ruth's Forum question:

1. Type (to me) is the sum total of the characteristics that make a dog look like the breed he is supposed to be. In a Basenji, these characteristics would obviously include wrinkle; erect, hooded ears; correctly set and curled tail; proper coat color and texture; overall profile (i.e. square as opposed to long in body or short on leg); and distinctive trotting gait. A dog with these characteristics (or most of them) would obviously look like a Basenji should look. The more of these characteristics a dog has, the 'typier' he would be.
2. These are just my feelings - I don't really have a source or reference."
