The 1984 BCOA National Specialty had 273 dogs totaling 427 entries which was the largest ever in the world. There were 86 class dogs, 118 class bitches, and 99 in the puppy sweepstakes. The non-regular classes consisted of 9 veteran dogs, 6 veteran bitches, 17 stud dogs, 12 brood bitches, 3 braces, and 1 team. Three entries were in junior showmanship. Exhibitors came from 31 different states in the U.S. plus Canada. Spectators came from as far away as Australia. Two dogs for a total of three entries were cancelled due to the judge change. \*\*\*\*\*
