Comment: Any overage in this fund was to be used for research. Rosemary Johnson, Chairperson for Health & Research, asked for suggestions from the membership through the BCOA Bulletin. Only three suggestions were received: Use it for a symposium at the next national specialty, donate it to the Morris Animal Foundation for study of canines, donate it to Dr. Breitschwerdt. There are three or four speakers on related health problems planned for Specialty weekend.

NOTE: Hospitality was paid for by the Show-Me Basenji Club with financial help from the Dallas/Ft. Worth Basenji Club and amounted to \$700.00

\*Due to the problems BCOA had with the Ramada (having to vacate rooms early) and the problems the Ramada had with exhibitors (letting their dogs urinate and defecate in the hotel), the actual settlement of payments is being negotiated. The amount of \$900 has been retained to cover these expenses. If it is not met, it will be returned to the BCOA general fund.

\*\*This amount includes charges to the BCOA for trophies procured for the lure-coursing trial by the BCGT. No receipt for detail was received for items purchased from Kennel-Aire.

The 1984 BCOA National Specialty had 273 dogs totaling 427 entries which was the largest ever in the world. There were 86 class dogs, 118 class bitches, and 99 in the puppy sweepstakes. The non-regular classes consisted of 9 veteran dogs, 6 veteran bitches, 17 stud dogs, 12 brood bitches, 3 braces, and 1 team. Three entries were in junior showmanship. Exhibitors came from 31 different states in the U.S. plus Canada. Spectators came from as far away as Australia. Two dogs for a total of three entries were cancelled due to the judge change.

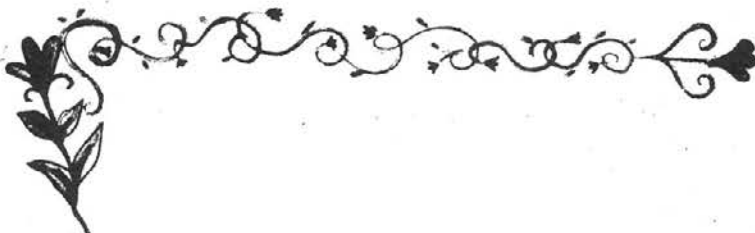
