

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR



This year it would be great to have everyone interested or nominated in running for office write up a background, somewhat like a personal resume. Having all nominees write a background would give us all some insight, so we can determine if people are really interested in Basenjis overall. There are many small, not as well known, intellegent members of the Basenji Fancy out there, who have a lot to contribute. Some have been around a long time and others are newer to Basenjis or may have started in and have another breed. If they truly care about Basenjis, they should have done something to help the Breed and not just their own. Rescue, lure coursing, taught handling or obedience, or judged are some examples. Have they been active members of a Basenii or All Breed Club?

For the benefit of our breed it behooves all of us to FIND OUT who will truly represent and do the work, be independent in their thinking and take counsel from the membership, with wisdom to delegate responsibilities. To find the best qualified person to be on comittees and not just because they are your friend. How much time can they honestly spare from their schedules to be an active officer?

Are they willing to listen to the membership's concerns and address them or promote only their own interests? Are they willing to ask and seek out members opinions?

We have more than a 100 member plus turnover every year in the BCOA. Truly we need to go to regional representation on the board and this would make for a somewhat more democratic system. So when you vote this year, take into account geographic representation as a factor. Many dog clubs have gone to the Regional Board system and so does ASFA where I personally know it works well.

Our President tells me a lot of people new in Basenjis do not care about what went on before they got in the Breed. I do not want to beleive that, for we should all be willing to learn from the past. There is some wonderful information out there from some older breeders (who may not even be active breeders) and in written material. We should all be willing to listen and read from the past in order to try and gain from what others have learned for the overall benefit of the Breed. Electing some knowledgable, hardworking, willing-to-listen, receptive officers would be a step in the right direction.
