## CLUB BUSINESS

CORRECTIONS TO CLUB BUSINESS, published in the January BULLETIN BOARD:

**Ballot #7** (petition to amend) was inadvertently designated as "Passed". As stated in the ballot, per Article VII, Section I of the B.C.O.A. By-Laws, Board approval is not necessary for the submission to a general membership vote of a petition to amend. All that is required are the recommendations of the Board members in regard to the petition. Regarding this petition, six Board members recommended against its adoption; three recommended favorably. Thus, if a designation were to be applied, it would have to be "NOT PASSED". A designation was listed & none was necessary.

## SPECIAL REPORT: INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBTAINING AKC LIMITED REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE

The AKC establishment of a limited registration option serves as another choice for breeders who wish to limit the breeding of a dog but do not wish to sell their dogs without papers, or who do not want to have their dogs neutered or spayed. A dog registered with an AKC limited registration shall be ineligible to be entered in breed competition however it CAN participate in obedience trials, tracking tests, hunting tests and field trials. In June of 1989 the limited registration option was formally approved.

Effective January 1, 1990, there will be a change in Section A of the reverse side of each registration application form issued. Rather than two, three choices will be in this section. The choices will be:

- 1] Limited registration - offspring NOT eligible for registration
- 2] Full registration - AKC registration as we now know it
- 3] Transfer of ownership

To obtain the limited registration, the litter owner would check box #1 in Section A of the registration application form & all litter owners would be required to sign Section A. No other information should be completed on the reverse side of the application. On the face of the application, a name choice as well as sex & color should be indicated. The application should then be submitted with the registration fee of \$6, sent to AKC, Department L. Litter owners will then receive a limited registration certificate. This will clearly state "Offspring of this dog not eligible for registration". Visually the certificate will differ from the present certificate. A full AKC registration certificate is white with a purple border. The limited registration certificate is white with an orange border.

If the dog is sold or given away, the reverse side of the certificate would be completed by the owner(s) in Section A, indicating the particulars of transfer to the new owner. The new owner would complete & sign Section B & submit the certificate with the required transfer fee of \$6. The dog will continue to carry the limited registration regardless of the number of times the dog is transferred.

Registration status CAN BE CHANGED FROM A LIMITED TO NON-LIMITED only if all the litter owner(s) agree. A special form will be provided by the AKC to

be completed by the litter owner(s) as well as the current owners for this purpose. A fee will be charged to change the registration status to unlimited registration. If a dog is registered without restriction & if at a later date the owner, who was not the litter owner, decided that the dog in question should not be bred, the dog's status CANNOT be changed to a limited registration. However, the owner would have the option of selling the dog either without papers or under a spay/neuter agreement.

It cannot be emphasized too strongly that the decision of whether or not the dog will be sold with a limited registration should be made PRIOR to the time the dog is sold. That way the litter owner will have the limited certificate available for the purchaser at the time of sale. If the certificate is not available at the time of sale, the litter owners should clearly advise the buyer or the recipient that the dog must first be registered in the litter owner's name & that the buyer will then be furnished with a limited registration certificate. The sale should not be consummated until the limited certificate is available.

Offspring of dogs registered with the limited certificate are NOT eligible for AKC registration. If registration of offspring is desired of a mating between your dog and another of the same breed, it is incumbent on you to be certain that the dog is registered with full registration privileges & that the person who represents himself as the dog owner is the actual owner of record. The only way to determine this is to demand to see the actual registration certificate before a mating takes place.

The person who is represented as the owner of the dog should be named on the certificate face. If the dog is not yet registered or transferred, or if the owner is not able to present the actual registration certificate, do not breed to this dog. Do NOT accept a pedigree as proof of registration (or eligibility) & subsequent offspring registration. Any correspondence or applications in connection with the limited registration should be sent to the attention of Department L at AKC.
